Connie taught Home and Consumer Science, or Home Ec. for those earlier students. She also filled in as needed in numerous subjects including English, Science, and Health. Connie provided more than teaching to her students. She mentored them to become kind and caring adults. She coached cheerleading for many years. She also was the Advisor for Future Homemakers of America (FHA) that transitioned to Family, Career and

Community Leaders of America (FCCLA). Connie took numerous kids to state and national tournaments with this organization and was recently honored with a Lifetime Achievement Award.

Eric taught Band and Choir to 5th through 12th grades. He started with the very basics and then helped students to expand their skills. Eric has conducted a jazz band and a pep band. He also taught many subjects in school including Computer Science, Accounting, and Drivers Education. During the early 90's Eric drove the Ski Bus, taking as many kids as wanted to go up to the local mountains to ski all day.

After over 30 years of teaching Eric and Connie retired with plans to maybe be snow birds spending

winters in Yuma.
Instead, they decided to take on the management of the local food bank.
Connie has written a number of grants to receive additional funding to supplement the state and federal funding. Along with other great volunteers,

they help supplement monthly groceries for those local citizens in need.

The couple stays active with other pursuits. Connie is currently on the Tekoa Parks and Recreation Board helping with the pool and all the other tasks of managing the city parks. She also fills in as a substitute teacher at our schools. Eric currently plays in the Spokane British Brass Band. He is also involved in the Milestone Car Club, which is holding an event during the weekend of Slippery Gulch.

Eric and Connie are still active in the school and community with their 3 grandchildren who are involved in sports, local clubs and the pool.

Jack has planted over 30,000 trees on his farm with a cover crop before moving back to town in 1996. He has improved the habitat for wildlife, lessened erosion and increased oxygen.

After he "retired", Jack moved back to town. He stayed busy by mowing the rest area each week and drove to Colfax monthly to pick up food for the local food bank.

Confused, she stopped for directions and was met by Anne Currier, who responded with "You can buy our house!"

In this welcoming community she raised her four children and her fur children, all of whom are familiar faces around town. This town continued to be a blessing as it came alongside her in incredible ways after the family was terribly injured in a car accident. When her children were grown she took up foster care.

For work and pleasure, Barbara strolls through the rolling Palouse forests and fields. She has traveled across the U.S. to earn a Master of Science in Silviculture and across the world to watch wheelchair races.

Sustained by her unwavering hope and joy that spring from her love of Christ she longs to serve others. Over the years she has served many summers as a wildland firefighter and has explored running homes for the elderly and housing refugees. Currently she is working to restore local waterways and training to be certified in EMS and ambulance driving.
